The Court confirms the tentative ruling as follows:

The Court rules on defendant Reliant Energy Servs, Inc.'s ("Reliant") motion for determination of good faith settlement as follows:

This unopposed motion for good faith settlement is GRANTED for the reasons stated below.

The factors that a Court considers in evaluating whether a settlement was made in good faith is set forth in *Tech-Bilt, Inc. v. Woodward-Clyde & Associates* (1985) 38 Cal.3d 488, 499 (hereafter "*Tech-Bilt*").

Here, Reliant has set forth sufficient evidence for this Court find that the requirements outlined in *Tech-Bilt* have been met in this case. Based on the information provided by the moving parties, the Court concludes that the settlement between the Class Plaintiffs and Reliant is within the ballpark of its proportionate share of liability. (Reliant's Notice of Lodgment, Exhibit 1; See also Reliant's Memorandum of Points and Authorities (Reliant's P&A"), pp. 2-3.) The Court also notes that no evidence of collusion, fraud, or tortious conduct has been brought to this Court's attention. (Reliant's P&A, p. 3.)
