I. <u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>:

The facility is well kept and the signage is large and well placed for youth to see. The facility does offer cells for secured youth when needed. Sgt. Brazelton explained that youth are rarely placed in secure detention, and logs indicate similar information with only one youth placed in secure detention in CY 2016.

When asked about LGBTQ+ youth, Sgt. Brazelton explained that youth are asked how they choose to identify and are detained accordingly.

II. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS (if any)</u>:

When documenting release information, the Commission recommends the Oceanside Police Department consistently specify the nature of the relationship between the minor taken into custody and the individual to whom the minor is released. Although this was done in some cases, there were many instances where it was not specifically noted whether the person to whom the minor was released was a parent, guardian, or responsible relative.

The call logs for each month were missing. Sgt. Brazelton explained that the Oceanside Police Department was not informed of the call logs and were thus unaware of the need to fill them out monthly. The Commission recommends having a call log sheet attached to the monthly secure and non-secure data logs each month to document when youth were offered calls during their detention.

*The logs for January, February and April 2016 were missing on the date of inspection so the data from these logs is not included in the 2016 Yearly Statistics listed at the top of the page.

There was some confusion with whether youth taken into custody pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code § 300 were counted towards the monthly count. The counts were off numerous times due to this inconsistency. Additionally, the cover sheets for January, February, and April were not available. The Commission recommends attaching the cover sheet monthly to the logs to ensure accuracy when comparing logs to the monthly data which is submitted to the Board of State and Community Corrections.
