Thanks to all of you who shared information about your ministries by filling out the blue forms in your folders. The breadth of offerings is an impressive testament to our community's generosity and compassion.

Many of our attendees reported robust programs supporting members of their own congregations and providing services to the larger community, keeping food banks, serving meals, and opening facilities to organizations such as Head Start and Alcoholics or Narcotics Anonymous. Other common offerings include Bible study and many types of counseling including marriage, domestic violence and individual counseling. More than one church supports Rachel's House for victims of domestic violence. One church hosts a charter school, and many churches give back-to-school backpacks. Multiple congregations open their doors for at least two weeks per year to provide housing for the homeless through the Interfaith Shelter Network of San Diego.
