I. <u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>:

During the inspection the Commissioner was able to see the area where the minors are held. It was clean, neat and organized. The required signs and notification to minors was posted in the area the minors are held. There are two benches where youth are placed when brought to the station which allows for separation of male and female minors. There is a work station for the deputies to complete their paperwork while keeping direct and constant supervision of the minors. The Commissioner was able to verify minors have access to restroom facilities, water, snacks and blankets. If a snack is not enough to satisfy the minor's hunger, deputies will provide food from a local fast food restaurant.

Secure and non-secure logs were reviewed for Calendar Year 2017. The logs were complete. When the logs are completed by the deputies the Sergeant will review them to ensure they are filled out properly.

There is a PERT team assigned to the Ramona station twice per week. The PERT team is shared with the Lakeside and Poway stations. The PERT team has been assigned to the station for more than a year and there are plans to expand the coverage in Ramona in the future. This is another tool that assists with keeping minors from being detained and/or from entering the juvenile justice system.

When asked about Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual and Transgender populations the Sergeant relayed that they are respected. When asked who searches a transgender minor, he relayed they will ask the minor who they are most comfortable with having search them. The deputies try to accommodate the request but there are more male deputies than female deputies assigned to the station. Therefore, the request may not always be accommodated. Officer and minor safety are paramount. They do not conduct strip searches, only pat-downs.

II. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS (if any)</u>:

- BSCC forms and reporting requirements have recently changed. The JJDPA and WIC §206 and §207 prohibit the Secure detention of status offenders (WIC §601) and nonoffenders (WIC §300/WIC §5150). Any violations must be reported to the BSCC on the Monthly Report on the Detention of Minors. - 2. There were not any recommendations made in the previous year's inspection.

The Sergeant in charge of overseeing the non-secured and secured minors' protocol has been in place for several years. This consistency of staff has proved to be beneficial ensuring protocols and paperwork are in order. There are no new recommendations.
