Coronado PD detains very few juveniles.

Coronado would like to have high school students participate in the Medical Examiner's program, "Beyond the Caution Tape."

Make sure log book forms are being filled out correctly. Box in front of sentence in the middle of the form is not being checked. Sgt. Hima will instruct officers.

The Juvenile Justice Commission should propose a County-wide regulation with regard to signage so that all jails and lock-ups within the County have the same sign.
