I. **GENERAL COMMENTS**:

This facility recently underwent a restructuring. Several staff moved out of the facility to another one. The facility is small and well-maintained. Appropriate signage is posted; policies are readily available and minors are appropriately supervised.

II. RECOMMENDATIONS (if any):

The Lemon Grove facility should address the following issues:

- 1. Log books should be more carefully reviewed; there was one critical error in math with regard to the amount of time a minor was held in unsecure detention. The logbook indicated the time the minor was detained was 4.75 hours when, in fact, the minor had been held in unsecure detention for 6:30 hours. This is over the 6 hour limit. (August 2013) There were also some entries that were a bit unclear, though careful inspection revealed that all the required information was recorded.
- A juvenile cannot be held in excess of a total of 6 hours in temporary custody. The Lemon Grove facility had 3 instances in 2013 where juveniles were held in custody for over 6 hours. The facility should take steps to prevent juveniles from being held in custody in excess of 6 hours.
