AS A TEMPORARY EMERGENCY MEASURE

Due to the life-threatening COVID-19 pandemic, the Governor of California has declared a state of emergency in this state. The President of the United States has also declared a national emergency. Based on the pandemic, the CDC, the California Department of Public Health, and local county health departments have recommended increasingly stringent social distancing measures of at least six feet between people, and encourage vulnerable individuals to avoid public spaces. The San Diego County jails are clearly places at high risk during this pandemic because they require the housing of individuals in close quarters.

On March 20, 2020, the Chief Justice of California issued an advisory recommending steps superior courts could take to mitigate the spread of the virus. Courts were "strongly encourage[d]" to "[r]evise, on an emergency basis, the countywide bail schedule to lower bail amounts significantly for the duration of the coronavirus emergency, including lowering the bail amount to \$0 for many lower level offenses – for all misdemeanors except for those listed in Penal Code section 1270.1 and for lower-level felonies. This will result in fewer individuals in county jails thus alleviating some of the pressures for arraignments within 48 hours and preliminary hearings within 10 days." This court implemented temporary emergency modifications to its countywide Bail Schedule effective April 2, 2020.

On April 6, 2020, the Judicial Council of the State of California enacted Emergency Rule 4 (the statewide Emergency Bail Schedule), reducing bail to zero for many offenses, after which this court rescinded its temporary emergency modifications to its countywide Bail Schedule. The Judicial Council then rescinded Emergency Rule 4 on June 10, 2020. However, the Judicial Council "urge[d] local courts to continue to use the emergency COVID-19 bail schedule where necessary to protect the health of the community, the courts, and the incarcerated."

Based on the Chief Justice's advisory and the Judicial Council's urging to continue with zero bail, the San Diego District Attorney's Office, San Diego City Attorney's Office, San Diego Public Defender's Office, and San Diego Sheriff's Office submitted requests to reinstate the temporary emergency modifications to the countywide Bail Schedule, with additional modifications.

Effective immediately, and for the duration of the General Orders of Presiding Judge Lorna A. Alksne relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 San Diego Superior Court Bail Schedule is modified as set forth below. Any provision of the 2020 San Diego Superior Court Bail Schedule not modified by the temporary emergency modifications set forth below remains in full force and effect.
