**GENERAL ORDER OF THE  
PRESIDING DEPARTMENT**

**ORDER NO. 010126-02**

**THIS COURT FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

This order has been developed for the protection of all persons with business in the courthouse facilities of the Superior Court of California, County of San Diego ("San Diego Superior Court," "court," or "courthouse"), and to ensure the safe, secure, orderly, and efficient handling of proceedings and court business. This order is consistent with California Rules of Court, rule 10.603, which vests in the Presiding Judge the responsibility of establishing policies and providing a forum for the fair and expeditious resolution of disputes, as well as California Rules of Court, rule 1.150, which establishes rules for media coverage within the courtroom. This order does not replace the Juvenile Court Media Policy, which establishes rules relating to photography, filming, recording, or broadcasting in Juvenile Court facilities. Requests for any exceptions to this order must be submitted to the court's Public Affairs Officer and will be considered by the Presiding Judge, Assistant Presiding Judge, or their designee.

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1       IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that absent written judicial authorization, there shall be no  
2     photographing, filming, recording, or broadcasting by the media, attorneys, or members of the  
3     general public within any of the San Diego Superior Court facilities or grounds, including but not  
4     limited to courtrooms, entrances and exits, the lobby areas, hallways, stairs, elevators and escalators,  
5     business offices, and temporary locations that may be set up from time to time to conduct court  
6     business on courthouse grounds outside of the courthouse building, except: (1) as permitted within  
7     a courtroom by a judicial officer under California Rules of Court, rule 1.150; and (2) those areas  
8     specifically designated by the court as media areas that are set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto, or  
9     in the Juvenile Court Media Policy, available on the court's website at [www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Juvenile](http://www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Juvenile).  
10    The Kearny Mesa Branch of the court has no designated media area; any and all photography,  
11    filming, recording, and broadcasting within or on the grounds of that facility is prohibited without  
12    written judicial authorization. Except for the above-referenced outside temporary locations, this  
13    order is not intended to restrict the ability to photograph, film, record, or broadcast from outside the  
14    entrances and exits of any courthouse facility, provided such activity does not obstruct access to or  
15    from the building, or compromise security.

16       Videotaping, photography, or electronic recording devices must be turned off while they are  
17    transported within any courthouse facility.

18       Any videotaping, photography, or electronic recording of the interior of a courtroom through  
19    the windows of the courtroom door is prohibited.

20       Jurors may not be videotaped, photographed, or electronically recorded anywhere within a  
21    courthouse facility at any time, with the exception that once jurors have been discharged from a case  
22    and have turned in their juror badges, they may be videotaped, photographed, or electronically  
23    recorded in designated media areas if they consent. Spectators may not be videotaped,  
24    photographed, or electronically recorded within a courtroom at any time, and may be videotaped,  
25    photographed, or electronically recorded outside a courtroom in designated media areas only if they  
26    consent.

27       Camera-enabled devices and devices that capture digital images or audio recordings,  
28    including but not limited to cell phones, watches, eyewear, or other AI-enabled accessories, may be

1 brought into the courthouse facilities and courtrooms, as long as the image capturing and audio  
2 recording features are not activated, used, or displayed without written authorization from a judicial  
3 officer.

4 Any person or entity, including but not limited to, individuals viewing or appearing remotely,  
5 who wishes to document, photograph, record, or broadcast any portion of a court proceeding must  
6 seek and be granted prior written judicial approval, and must inform the court security staff of their  
7 intentions. Further, any person or entity, including but not limited to, individuals viewing or  
8 appearing remotely, who wishes to document, photograph, record or broadcast any portion of a court  
9 proceeding is prohibited from using generative artificial intelligence ("AI") unless prior written  
10 judicial approval is granted to use AI.

11 Law enforcement officers with body worn cameras (BWC) shall not activate the recording  
12 function of the camera unless involved in a law enforcement activity in the courthouse. If a BWC  
13 is activated inside the courthouse, the law enforcement officer shall inform the Presiding Judge of  
14 the activation as soon as practical. In the event a BWC is activated in a courtroom, the law  
15 enforcement officer shall notify the judicial officer assigned to that courtroom as soon as practical.  
16 Department court-assigned personnel shall not activate their BWC device to record: (1) attorney-  
17 client communications; (2) courthouse users who are acting lawfully; or (3) jury selection, in-  
18 chambers proceedings, *Pitchess* motion proceedings, *Marsden* motion proceedings, other closed  
19 hearings, or court staff meetings.

20 This order is not intended to interfere with or restrict the rights of the media to request  
21 permission from a judicial officer to allow media coverage within a particular courtroom, nor to  
22 interfere with the ability of each judicial officer to rule on such media requests, in conformity with  
23 California Rules of Court, rule 1.150.

24 This order does not restrict or otherwise prohibit arrangements set up by the court's Public  
25 Affairs Officer to allow photographing, recording, or broadcasting by the media based on individual  
26 circumstances in an alternate location other than those set forth in Exhibit A. Such requests will be  
27 considered and a response provided by the Presiding Judge, Assistant Presiding Judge, or their  
28 designee.

1 Special requests for photographing or filming of unoccupied courtrooms, jury rooms, or  
2 employee work areas must be made in writing to the court's Public Affairs Officer.


3 A violation of this order may be the basis for an order terminating further media coverage, a  
4 citation for contempt, confiscation of personal electronic devices, and/or an order imposing  
5 monetary or other sanctions.

6 This order shall become effective on January 1, 2026, and expire on December 31, 2026,  
7 unless otherwise ordered by this court.

8 Service of this order shall be made on the San Diego County Sheriff's Department.

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**EXHIBIT "A"**

**GENERAL ORDER OF THE PRESIDING DEPARTMENT, ORDER NO. 010125-02**

**EXHIBIT A – DESIGNATED MEDIA AREAS**

Photos, videos, press conferences, and on-camera statements to members of the media and the general public are allowed only in the following designated media areas:

**Central Division, Central Courthouse (1100 Union Street, San Diego, CA 92101)**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Floor – South End of Hallway, Left of Dept. 102
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor – South End of Hallway, Left of Dept. 202
- 3<sup>rd</sup> thru 22<sup>nd</sup> Floor – North End of Hallway next to Elevators

**Central Division, Hall of Justice (330 West Broadway, San Diego, CA 92101)**

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor – East or West End of Hallway
- 4<sup>th</sup> Floor – East or West End of Hallway
- 5<sup>th</sup> Floor – East or West End of Hallway
- 6<sup>th</sup> Floor – East or West End of Hallway

**East County Courthouse (250 East Main Street, El Cajon, CA 92020)**

- Ground Floor – Wall, North of Elevator Entrance
- 1<sup>st</sup> Floor – Wall, North of Elevator Entrance
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor – Wall, North of Dept. 7 or Wall, South of Dept. 8
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor – Wall, North of Dept. 11 or Wall, South of Dept. 10
- 4<sup>th</sup> Floor – Wall, North of Dept. 16 at Entrance to Elevator Lobby

**North County Courthouse (325 South Melrose Dr., Vista CA 92081)**

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor – North or South of Elevator – Opposite Courtroom Involved in Media Event
- 4<sup>th</sup> Floor – North or South of Elevator – Opposite Courtroom Involved in Media Event
- 1<sup>st</sup> Floor – North Building Lobby – South Wall

1 **South County Courthouse (500 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Chula Vista, CA 91910)**

2 ➤ 1<sup>st</sup> Floor Lobby – North of the Upward Escalator

4 Cameras must film toward the wall (as opposed to down the hallway) in these designated  
5 areas that are marked by signage.

6 For photography, filming, recording, or broadcasting within or on the grounds of the Juvenile  
7 Court, see the Juvenile Court Media Policy, available on the court's website at  
8 [www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Juvenile](http://www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Juvenile). The Kearny Mesa Branch of the court has no authorized designated  
9 media area; any and all photography, filming, recording, and broadcasting within or on the grounds  
10 of that facility is prohibited without written judicial authorization.
