**GENERAL ORDER OF THE  
PRESIDING DEPARTMENT**  
**ORDER NO. 010126-06**

In accordance with the authority vested in the Presiding Judge under rule 10.603 of the California Rules of Court and pursuant to the provisions of Welfare & Institutions Code section 246,  
IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Superior Court Judge Ana Espana is designated for 2026 as the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court and is charged with the responsibilities established by California law.

The following superior court judges are designated as judges of the Juvenile Court for 2026, and shall be vested with the authority to hear all cases under Part 1, Chapter 2, of Division 2, of the Welfare & Institutions Code (“juvenile cases”):

6      Every judge of the Superior Court, County of San Diego ("San Diego Superior Court"), who  
7      is assigned to preside over a juvenile case is designated as a judge of the Juvenile Court during the  
8      pendency of the proceedings. Every judge of the San Diego Superior Court who is assigned to  
9      preside over a criminal matter in which it is determined the sentence should be recalled and the  
10     defendant resentenced, and the recall of sentence requires defendant be remanded for a juvenile  
11     transfer hearing, is designated as a judge of the Juvenile Court during the pendency of the juvenile  
12     transfer hearing in that case. The Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court may designate any other  
13     judge of the San Diego Superior Court as a judge of the Juvenile Court for any specified purpose, to  
14     the extent it may be necessary and convenient for the management of a specific case in that judge's  
15     court.

16     This order shall become effective on January 1, 2026, and expire on December 31, 2026,  
17     unless otherwise ordered by this court.
