


## BUDGET

The goal of the Superior Court of California, County of San Diego, is to provide the highest level of service within budgeted appropriations.



\* As of 01/01/21

**Salaries and Benefits** - Salaries and benefits of all court employees, except for judges, whose salaries are paid directly by the state.

**Services and Supplies** - Costs of office furniture, supplies, telecommunications and contractual services such as information technology and printing services.

**Security** - In FY 11-12, as a result of Trial Court Security Realignment (AB 118), sheriff-related security costs for courtroom security and perimeter security were transferred to the County of San Diego. The remaining security costs in the court budget include such areas as after-hours security for facilities and security equipment maintenance.

**Fixed Assets** - Purchase of equipment costing more than \$5,000 (e.g., furniture, copy machines).

**Minor's Counsel** - The costs to appoint private counsel to represent the interests of the child in a custody or visitation proceeding.

**Other Expenses** - Includes payments of County services (e.g., custodial costs), collection costs and traffic school monitoring costs.

## FILINGS

Hundreds of thousands of Superior Court cases are handled each year in San Diego County. From July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 (Fiscal Year 2019/2020), total filings for all case types were nearly 390,000.

## Welcome

*Welcome to the San Diego Superior Court – what a difference a year makes! Last year was consumed by changes throughout the Court, and our community, due to the COVID-19*

*pandemic. We started 2020 optimistic that budget hurdles of the past had finally been cleared, but nearly everything came to a halt in mid-March. As public health departments and government leaders grappled with how to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the Court closed for all but the most urgent services.*

*With this challenge has come great opportunity. During the Court's six-week service limitation to the public, we worked diligently to transform the way we operate. In a court system that previously held very few remote proceedings, mainly limited to Civil cases, we have now logged countless virtual hearings across every case type. The move to virtual hearings came out of necessity to keep people safe and socially distant, but it can be an added convenience for court users – a traffic-ticketed tourist can now handle their hearing from the other side of the country, parents involved in a family law matter can now appear during a workday break, and attorneys juggling several cases can spend less time commuting to different courthouses.*

*As the theme of online access continued throughout 2020, we introduced a web-based reservation system for Civil Independent Calendar motions and allowed the use of additional e-filing service providers. Community outreach efforts shifted to virtual tours and "Judges in the Classroom" presentations to inform distance-learning students about the Court and the justice system.*

*The effects of the difficulties first seen in 2020 will continue in 2021 as we keep our workforce and our court users safe from COVID-19. We have taken budget cuts head-on with both voluntary and mandatory furloughs, paired with employees on COVID-related leave and a hiring freeze. We are continually adjusting to our new way of doing business and look forward to making public access even easier as we renovate our website to be a mobile-friendly spot for people to go first for information.*

*Enclosed you'll find a summary of our budget, recent case filings, a list of self-help services available to the public and details on the types of cases that can be filed at each of our seven locations. On behalf of our 135 judges, 19 commissioners and more than 1,100 employees, welcome to the San Diego Superior Court.*



### JURY SERVICE INFORMATION

When you receive a summons to serve as a juror in the Superior Court, you are being asked to play a crucial role in the administration of justice. Some of the services provided by the court to ensure a smooth juror experience include:

#### 24/7 Access

The court's Jury Services office maintains a telephone line to assist jurors with questions regarding jury service 24 hours a day, by calling 619-844-2800. A court staff member is available by phone from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and until noon on Friday. Jurors may also access the court's website to get more information concerning jury service and to request an excuse or postpone jury service at [www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Jury](http://www.sdcourt.ca.gov/Jury).

#### One Day/One Trial

Under California law, once a juror has appeared or has served through Telephone Standby, the juror does not have to serve again for a period of 12 months.

#### Free Transportation for Jurors Serving at the Central Courthouse

The Superior Court, in partnership with SANDAG, offers complimentary bus/trolley or coaster passes on the first day of jury service for those serving at the Central Courthouse or the Hall of Justice. See the jury summons for more information. This service is for jurors serving at the Central courts only.

#### Court Transfer

Prospective jurors can request a transfer of jury service to a more convenient Superior Court location within the county.

#### Wireless Internet Access

Free Wireless Internet Service is provided for jurors serving at each court location.

### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Community outreach and education are essential to the San Diego Superior Court. By establishing and maintaining strong ties to the community and promoting knowledge about how our system of justice works, the court is better able to fulfill its mission of administering justice in a way that is both accessible and understandable to the public.
