As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Governor of California declared a state of emergency in this state. The President of the United States has also declared a national emergency. The health and safety concerns associated with the pandemic, along with the State of California and County of San Diego public health orders issued in response thereto, have caused substantial operational changes for the court since March 17, 2020.

On June 15, 2021, the State of California fully reopened its economy and allowed businesses and public entities, including the court, to generally return to usual operations, subject to some ongoing risk-reduction measures such as requiring face coverings for unvaccinated individuals but making them optional for fully vaccinated individuals. On July 27, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"), recommended that fully vaccinated individuals wear a face covering in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. The County of San Diego and State of California public health authorities subsequently adopted the CDC's guidance

reducing community transmission of COVID-19. In light of this progress, and subject to and in accordance with Cal/OSHA and CDPH guidelines, effective November 15, 2021, face coverings 5

follow applicable guidance from county, state, and federal public health authorities, including, but

not limited to, prohibiting individuals from entering if they are subject to an isolation or quarantine

order or are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, continuing increased cleaning measures, and

providing hand sanitizer kiosks.

For good cause and pursuant to the court's inherent supervisory and administrative authority, as well as the Presiding Judge's duty to promote access to justice for all members of the public, taking into account the needs of the public and court as they relate to the efficient and effective management of the court (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 10.603), and in order to protect the health and safety of the public, court personnel, judicial officers, parties, attorneys, witnesses, and law enforcement officers, this court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Effective November 15, 2021, at 7:00 a.m., and until further notice, the court will follow applicable guidance from county, state, and federal health authorities and impose COVID-19 riskreduction measures as follows:

1. For individuals who are not court employees: Face coverings are optional, but recommended, for fully vaccinated individuals, and face coverings are required for individuals who are not fully vaccinated. Any individual not wearing a face covering inside a court facility is selfattesting that they are fully vaccinated in compliance with the requirements of the current California Department of Public Health Guidance for the Use of Face Coverings ("CDPH Guidance").1

Persons younger than two years old are exempt from wearing a face covering. Unvaccinated persons exempted by the CDPH Guidance, such as those with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering, will be assisted outside the courthouse or provided with an alternative accommodation. Any unvaccinated person without a face covering may be denied entry to, or removed from, the courthouse or courtroom.

- 2. For court employees: Face coverings are optional, but recommended, for fully vaccinated individuals, and face coverings are required for individuals who are not fully vaccinated. To be considered fully vaccinated and eligible to remove their face covering in the workplace, court employees must follow the proof-of-vaccination procedures communicated by the Executive Officer, including any subsequent modifications to that procedure. All court employees will be considered not fully vaccinated and required to wear a face covering in the workplace unless and until they have successfully completed the current procedure. Court staff who are not fully vaccinated may remove their face covering when working in an office or room alone or when actively eating or drinking provided they are able to maintain six feet of social distancing from persons who are not members of the same household. Other employees exempted by applicable CDPH Guidance or Cal/OSHA regulations, such as those with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering, may be provided with an alternative accommodation, if available. Any employee that is not fully vaccinated in accordance with this paragraph may not enter any court facility without a face covering unless they have a pre-approved alternate accommodation.
- 3. Notwithstanding the above, the court may designate certain areas within its facilities where all persons, including court employees, will be required to wear face coverings, regardless of vaccination status. The court will post signs in these areas indicating face coverings are required, regardless of vaccination status. As of the date of this general order, such areas include Family Court Counselor Offices and Children's Waiting Rooms; however, the court may subsequently modify the areas requiring universal face coverings as determined by the Executive Officer. In such areas, persons younger than two years old are exempt from wearing a face covering, and persons exempted by the CDPH Guidance, such as those with a medical condition, mental health condition,

or disability that prevents wearing a face covering, will be assisted outside the applicable court area or provided with an alternative accommodation. Any non-exempt person without a face covering may be denied entry to, or removed from, such designated areas.

- 4. All persons, including court staff and judicial officers, are required to self-evaluate for symptoms and may not enter the courthouse if they are subject to an isolation or quarantine order or exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms as described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-("CDC") (available at: testing/symptoms.html), which currently include, but are not limited to, fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- 5. This order does not restrict or otherwise abrogate the express and inherent authority of the court and its judges to provide for the orderly conduct of proceedings, control in the furtherance of justice the conduct of persons connected with judicial proceedings, or to control processes and orders so as to make them conform to law and justice. Specifically, if a judicial officer determines it is necessary to the furtherance of justice to wear or remove their face covering when on the bench or to direct an individual in their courtroom to wear or remove their face covering, they may do so.
- 6. Effective November 15, 2021, at 7:00 a.m., General Order of the Presiding Department of the San Diego Superior Court, In Re: Face-Coverings, Order No. 081821-84, is rescinded as moot.
