The North Coastal Station of the Sheriff's Department was under construction at the time of the inspection and therefore no lockup facilities were available for either adults or juveniles. The build-out should be complete sometime in the Spring of 2017. Another inspection should be scheduled next year.

- 1. White-out should not be used on the logs, cross-outs should be used instead.
- 2. In some instances, the name of persons picking up juveniles was omitted.
- 3. Phone logs should be completed in all instances. Backup staff should be instructed.
