I. <u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>:

*Data was missing from secure and on-secure detentions from June to December 2017. La Mesa Police Department (LMPD) stated that they do not record detentions for WIC 601 or WIC 300 offenses. LMPD is a large, well-organized facility with a "sally port" entrance, large spaces for juvenile intakes including a "soft" interview room. There are separate adult cells. Between January and May 2017, there were eight (8) non-secure detentions under 6 hours, and two (2) secure detention under 6 hours. There were no records of detentions over 6 hours.

II. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS (if any)</u>:

- BSCC forms and reporting requirements have recently changed. The JJDPA and WIC §206 and §207 prohibit the Secure detention of status offenders (WIC §601) and nonoffenders (WIC §300/WIC §5150). Any violations must be reported to the BSCC on the Monthly Report on the Detention of Minors. For more information, please refer to the section on Youth in Adult Detention Facilities on the BSCC webpage: <u>http://www.bscc.ca.gov/s_fsoservices.php</u>
- 2. Administrator surmised that representatives from the BSCC took the original logs to Sacramento by accident. Since our visit, she (LMPD staff) has been unable to locate them. She does not have duplicates of the originals. Therefore, JJC recommends that copies should be made of all logs in the future. All inspections by BSCC and other entities should be closely supervised. The forms utilized should conform with the forms supplied by JJC instead of the one-page summary sheet currently utilized by LMPD. All detentions should be included, not to exclude WIC 601 or WIC 300 offenses.
