I. **GENERAL COMMENTS**:

The San Diego Police Department's Southeastern Division is located in a neighborhood of socio-economic diversity. It is well run by excellent and committed personnel. This was the first year that the Juvenile Justice Commission has inspected any San Diego Police divisions and although we found the documentation to be differently formatted, the logs were well-organized and easy to read. We discovered that the San Diego Police does not hold any youth in secure detention—so the statistics were only based on non-secure detentions under 6 hours. Upon a detention, the juvenile is either released to a family member or transported to Juvenile Hall. Interestingly, the Southeastern Division has its own in-house diversion program for youth (mostly curfew violations) allowing many juveniles to attend classes with their parents either at the station or at Second Chance (located nearby).

II. RECOMMENDATIONS (if any):

- BSCC forms and reporting requirements have recently changed. The JJDPA and WIC §206 and §207 prohibit the Secure detention of status offenders (WIC §601) and nonoffenders (WIC §300/WIC §5150). Any violations must be reported to the BSCC on the Monthly Report on the Detention of Minors. - 2. Continue the excellent community relationships including meeting with parents and juveniles at the Division. Attempt to fill some vacant staff positions in the juvenile officer ranks.
