I. GENERAL COMMENTS:

This year's lockup inspection included detentions from 2019 and 2020. Due to the COVID outbreak a lockup inspection was not conducted in 2020.

In 2019 there were 33 non-secure detentions under six (6) hours and two (2) secured detentions under six (6) hours. There were not any detentions over six (6) hours. In 2020 there were ten (23) non-secured detentions under six (6) hours and no (0) secured detentions under six (6) hours. There were not any detentions over six (6) hours.

The facility and juvenile accommodations were clean. There were ample snacks, water and blankets available for youth. The youth are kept in a separate holding from where adults are housed. There is a constant visual and all youth are within hearing distance of the deputies supervising them.

During the review of the logs, it was noted most crimes were misdemeanors. In particular, there were 12 arrests for PC242 (Misdemeanor Battery) with nine (9) documented in January 2020. Few detained youths were taken to Kearny Mesa Juvenile Detention Facility and most were released to relatives/guardians.

All paperwork was complete and in order. Segreant Scroggins has been assigned to this station

for a number of years and his eye for detail has ensured the paperwork is accurate and complete. He is commended for his work; Therefore, there are not any recommendations from the inspection.
