I. <u>GENERAL COMMENTS</u>:

This year's lockup inspection included detentions from 2019 and 2020. Due to the COVID outbreak a lockup inspection was not conducted in 2020.

In 2019 there were five (5) non-secure detentions under six (6) hours and no (0) secured detentions under six (6) hours. There were not any detentions over six (6) hours. In 2020 there were three (3) non-secured detentions under six (6) hours and two (2) secured detentions under six (6) hours. There were not any detentions over six (6) hours.

The facility and juvenile accommodations were clean. There were ample snacks, water and blankets available for youth. The youth are kept in a separate holding from where adults are housed. There is a constant visual and all youth are within hearing distance of the deputies supervising them.

This station had a minimal amount of detained youth in the past two years as compared to other rural sub-stations. The two secured detentions noted serious crimes of PC 664/187, PC 211 and two counts of PC182.6. All other detentions were for less serious crimes.

It was noted that a running log for the year of 2019 was being used. This was corrected by Sergeant Delocht and in 2020 monthly logs were used. Other than the running log in 2019 all

other paperwork was complete and in order. Segreant Delocht is commended for improving the record keeping on detained youth. There are not any recommendations from the inspection as the only issue had been corrected prior to the inspection.
