I. GENERAL COMMENTS:

During the inspection the Sargeant relayed there have not been any changes at this station since the last inspection. The number of minors detained remains low. There was a total of three this past year; two non-secured and one secured. All three were under the six-hour time limit. Two were released home and one was transported to the Probation Department detention facility.

Documentation supported minors are provided phone calls. Signage was clear and visible for minors regarding their rights. Deputies also discuss the minors' rights with them. Minors and adults continue not to be housed in the same area. Minors are not placed in cells unless safety issues exist, which continues to be rare and was not used this inspection period. The minors sit on a bench with a deputy present while paperwork is being completed.

All documentation was complete and orderly. It was easy to follow the detention records. Crimes documented included brandishing a dirk/dagger, having a concealed handgun (gang related), driving under the influence and evading the police.

The Poway station continues to do a great job working with minors.

II. RECOMMENDATIONS (if any):

As in previous years the station does a great job working with minors and paperwork supports procedure mirrors policy. There are not any recommendations as a result of this inspection.
